

Park Avenue Autumn Reopens in Former General Assembly Space

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Park Avenue Autumn (also Spring, Summer, Winter), the previously shuttered UES restaurant concept that changes menus, design and names seasonally is reopening in the former General Assembly/Hurricane Club space in Flatiron next Tuesday. Restaurateur Michael Stillman is taking a more casual approach this time around and has tapped chefs Zene Flinn (an alum of the original) and Benkei O'Sullivan (*ABC Kitchen*) to man the stoves. Expect a few dishes to return from the original like the Park Ave IN-N-Out Burger, Broccoli and Cheetos®, Duck Fat & Black Garlic Potatoes, as well as a few new dishes like Kentucky fried quail and sweet potato biscuits.



The Autumn space, designed by AvroKO, channels the Pacific Northwest with a nautically-inspired theme. You'll find wooden tables, leather placements and a 10-foot tall floral arrangement cascading down the windows in the main room.

In the drinks department, head barman/*Clover Club* vet Bryan Schneider offers takes on classic cocktails including a seasonal variation of a Manhattan and a Mai Chai, a fall spin on the Tiki staple made with aged rum, pumpkin butter, pepita syrup and orange.
